Members of the Junior and Senior Classes who meet the scholarship cumulative quality grade point average of 3.50 will receive a letter inviting you to fill out the application. Download the following application and keep a copy for your files.

Marian Catholic High School participates in the Robert F. Kennedy Chapter of the National Honor Society.

NHS members embody four important elements:

Scholarship: Students who have a cumulative **quality** grade point average of 3.50 or higher at the end of their Sophomore or Junior year meet the scholarship requirement. You will receive an invitation if you qualify academically. **This does not guarantee membership.** If you are a junior, and you feel that you cannot meet the requirements, you can apply in your senior year if your average is 3.50 or higher.

Character: The student of good character upholds principles of morality and ethics, is cooperative, demonstrates high standards of honesty and reliability, demonstrates courtesy, concern, and respect for others.

Leadership: Student Leaders are those who are resourceful, good problem-solvers, promoters of school activities, idea-contributors, dependable, and persons who exemplify positive attitudes about life. Leadership experiences should be demonstrated and can be drawn from school or community activities.

Service: This quality is defined through the voluntary contributions made by a student to the school, parish, and community, done without compensation and with a positive, courteous, and enthusiastic spirit. Students must complete at least 25 officially documented service hours to be eligible for consideration by the Faculty Council. These service hours must be completed no more than ten months (December) prior to submitting your application. Service that is done in September of this year indicates that the student does not make a habit of service but does it only to apply to the Society. All service hours must be completed by October 1. To maintain your membership, 20 additional service hours during the school year will be required. In addition, each member must participate in some way in all NHS sponsored projects (e.g. blood mobile, daffodil sale, food drives) and pay the required dues. ***See addendum for the 2020-21 school year concerning quarantine restrictions and the service requirements.

The Induction date is scheduled for the school Mass on the second Wednesday in November.

All students who will be inducted will receive confirmation prior to this date informing them of the Faculty Committee's selection. Students will purchase their NHS stoles for \$25.00, which are to be worn at the induction ceremony and graduation.

Section Four: Leadership and Service

Any questions regarding service should be addressed to Dr. Fetter before September 1.

In order to fulfill the service requirement of the National Honor Society, a student shall demonstrate leadership qualities and meaningful service at Marian Catholic High School and in the community and parish.

Part One:

School Service Hours should not be the same as your required school hours, nor can they all be from sports camps.

Deadline for completion of service is October 1.

Students applying for acceptance into the National Honor Society should demonstrate initiative, drive, and consistent dedication to service in the school, community, and parish. This service should fulfill a genuine need within the school, community, and parish, should go above and beyond accepted norms of social courtesy, and should be performed in conjunction with a recognized group or service organization and be completed by October 1st. A **variety** of service experiences are required.

Any type of fundraising, including "canning" for sports, and cleaning homerooms, or any other service done during school hours will not be accepted. Baking and hanging posters for school functions will earn partial credit (1/4 of an hour). Service must be for an official organization (i.e., not for family or relatives). Any service receiving monetary or academic compensation will not be considered.

Please list service completed in connection with school, community, and parish activities on the *Service Accounting Table* found on the next page. For those activities that occurred through an official club or organization, list the club name as well as the moderator. For those activities performed apart from an official club or organization, list the faculty/staff/coach who most closely supervised your work. Use only the space provided, listing in order of importance or number of hours earned.

***Addendum for the 2020-21 School Year

Concerning Service and Quarantine Responsibilities

Although this time of quarantine has presented many challenges, it has also presented many opportunities, some novel occasions, to demonstrate those qualities that are the foundation of the National Honor Society, *Scholarship, Leadership, Character, and Service*. It is understandable that you may not have had the same opportunities for service as you had before quarantine, but leadership and character demand that we recognize the new opportunities born in adversity and difficulty.

If the "quantity" of service hours, as previously defined, has been a challenge to you during quarantine, you may <u>supplement</u> the "quantity" of service hours with an essay about service of no more than 250 words on *how you positively contribute to your community during this time*. Students who choose to submit an essay in lieu of the required number of service hours might discuss:

- Traditional service hours/opportunities, and their meaning
- Matters of good citizenship
- Mastering a new skill or talent
- ❖ This time as an impetus for creativity or innovation
- Promoting self-care during this time, specifically as aspects of Respect for Life and Dignity of the Person
- Spiritual growth or opportunities for prayer
- ❖ The responsibility to meet the current challenges with grace and dignity
- How your service has made a difference or impacted others, and its meaning
- Service as an act of free will; given freely, without compensation or reward
- The habit of service as a defining characteristic.

Ultimately, service is about good citizenship, social conscience, contributing to your community, as well as concern and consideration for others. Your **Service Essay** should elucidate on **how YOU positively contribute to your community at this challenging time**. If you choose to submit the **Service Essay** to supplement your "quantity" of required service hours, it should be labeled as **Service Essay** and included with your **Community Service Accounting Table** in **Section Four: Leadership and Service** of your application.

Alternatively, some students may have found the current situation enabled their completion of the service hour requirement in the traditional manner. In which case, the supplemental **Service Essay** would **NOT** be required. Ultimately, the National Honor Society's emphasis on service is about positively contributing to your community, good citizenship, social conscience, and benevolence. Students may demonstrate their commitment to serving others in different ways.

As matters of Respect for Life and Dignity of the Person, we are called as servants of God to comply with quarantine and social distancing guidelines. It is also a matter of Social Justice, as Preferential Option for the Poor and Vulnerable. Actions that are contrary to our mission and beliefs cannot be defined as "service".
